Loraine's goal for Caribbean International is to be the go-to for any shipper throughout the world.

"We want to be global in our personal, caring services in the time of need when it's desperation and disaster. They know that they can trust us with their shipments, that they're going to get premier service that comes from a personal relationship," says Loraine. "It's very personal sending your mother food because where she lives she's not able to acquire food on her own. I want them to know that it is a personal relationship."
