As we strive to become a high-income nation, our need to create an effective, economically viable and environmentally sound solid waste management system that supports the country's development is paramount. By sharing our best practices and inviting other nations to share their own, we hope to leave a legacy."

The ISWA World Congress 2018 will feature a comprehensive scientific programme highlighting the socio-economic impacts of waste recycling, waste reduction, and health, safety and policy regulation pertaining to recycling and climate change.
